Basic Modalities

The workshop is open to 20 Ph.D. students and young researchers coming Europe and Africa. Applicants are invited to submit proposals that address the above mentioned topics. Applicants are asked to send a 500-word abstract of their papers, a one-page outline of their Ph.D. status and a CV. The selection will be conducted by the executive comittee of the Aborne network (http://www.aborne.org/neu/index.php/home/executive-committee).

Priority will be given to students and researchers with recent field experience and fresh research results. Application by research students coming from African Universities is encouraged. The final deadline for submitting proposals is 15 March 2010. Participants will be informed of acceptance by 31 March 2008. Participants are expected to register in the afternoon of Sunday 25 July 2010. Working sessions will be held from Monday 26 July through Friday 30 July, 2010, with departure the following day, Saturday 31 July.
